

WATER USAGE DEDUCT METER INSTALLATION REQUIREMENTS

All meters installed as deduct meters for water usage systems shall meet the following standards:

- The brand of meter shall be a <u>Neptune ProCoder R900-I</u> as required by Kent County Water Authority
- Meter shall calculate use only in Cubic Feet (CuFt)
- Meter shall be radio frequency capable.
- Backflow must be installed after main meter setting and not the deduct meter
- Thermal Expansion Tank
- Hose Connection/Sillcock vacuum breaker
- Water pressure regulator
- Inspection approval sticker must be attached to deduct meter
- Serial number must remain intact on the meter, this will be documented as well as the initial meter reading during the final inspection.
- Homeowner or Master Plumber is responsible for setting up final inspection so that
 initial reading and serial can be collected; this will be used to create a deduct meter
 account with the town for future billing.

Process for installation:

- 1. Installation may be done by either the homeowner or a master plumber.
- Installer must obtain a permit from our online portal at (https://coventryri.portal.opengov.com/)
- 3. Once meter is installed, final inspection must be scheduled on OpenGov with Sewer Authority/Engineering
- 4. Inspector reviews meter installation, initial reading and serial number added to permit information
- 5. Tax Department receives confirmation of inspection and meter information and will add the deduct meter to your sewer usage account
- 6. Homeowners will be sent notification in December, with meter reading information requiring submission by Jan. 15th. Your annual bill will reflect a reduction, using either your annual deduct meter reading **OR** the automatic discount given on the total Kent County Water used. Whichever is greater.
